About the Institute

The vast rural hinterland, comprising of the districts of Hooghly, Bankura, Purulia, Midnapore and Burdwan had been left uncared for in British India. The situation did not improve much even in the initial years of India's Independence. It was in this atmosphere of constant hardship and frustration that Dr. Radhakrisna Pal, the then M. L. A. of the area, freedom fighter and educationist took up an uphill task of spreading education from primary to college level. With this end in view, he set up in this region a number of educational institutions all by himself. He dreamt a dream of setting up at Bengai, a Degree College and named it after Smt. Aghorekamini Roy and Sri Prakashchandra Roy, the parents of Dr. Bidhan Chandra Roy, the then Chief Minister of West Bengal. On January 4, 1959, Dr. Roy laid the foundation stone of the dream college which started its functioning in the same year and was affiliated, at first, to the University of Calcutta. Later, in the year 1960, it came under the jurisdiction of the University of Burdwan.

- Measures initiated by the Institution for the promotion of gender equality during the year.
 - "Women's Empowerment" being at the core of "Institutional Distinctiveness" of the college. Gender equity and gender sensitization issues are addressed in the different courses taught by subjects like Bengali, English, Economics, Philosophy, History and Political Science within the curricular framework. Seminars, webinars, events and co-curricular activities have been organized to create and enhance awareness about gender issues. To ensure safety and security, entry to the college campus is restricted. The security personnel at the main entrance regularly verify the identity of all entrants. The college campus is under 24-hour CCTV surveillance. ICC (Internal Complain Committee) The Women's Cell, the Anti-ragging Cell and the Anti-Sexual-Harassment Cell of the college are involved in gender sensitization and awareness creation against gender discrimination. For the awareness of all our stakeholders the IQAC, the Sexual Harassment Cell and the Women's Cell of our college have jointly organized different workshops on our college campus.
- Environmental Consciousness and Sustainability/Alternate Energy initiatives taken by the institution.

The institution has a well-defined scheme for the proper collection, storage, and subsequent disposal of its various degradable and non-degradable wastes (solid waste, liquid waste, e-waste, and hazardous chemicals). As far as solid wastes are concerned, separate collection bins (for degradable and non-degradable wastes) are installed at various strategic locations within the college premises. Periodically they are collected and disposed of by relevant agencies. The e-waste like old and disposed computers, printers, keyboards and other computer peripherals are stored in a separate isolated chamber. Specific collection agencies are employed on a periodic basis for subsequent clearing up of the accumulated waste as and when required. The liquid wastes (including hazardous liquids) from the chemistry laboratory are conducted separately through dedicated conduits and stored in specially constructed and isolated concrete-lined pits.

Academic and Administrative Audit (AAA)

Academic and Administrative Audit (AAA) Report for the Academic Year 2020-21

We, the members of the Academic and Administrative Audit team have conducted the Academic and Administrative Audit for the academic year 2020-21 of Aghorekamini Prakashchandra Mahavidyalaya, Bengai, Hooghly, West Bengal.

Observations of Auditors: SWOC Analysis and Recommendations

A. STRENGTHS:

- Highly motivated team of well-qualified and subject-specialized faculty.
- Well-equipped, spacious, smart classrooms and laboratories.
- > Well-maintained and periodically updated library.
- Availability of computer lab in the Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics, Geography and Commerce departments.
- Computer lab with high end systems with software such as MATHEMATICA, SCILAB, Tally etc.
- Classes oriented to help students to enhance subject knowledge.
- Nourishing environmental knowledge through Pisciculture, cultivation of Medicinal Plants and laying Botanical gardens, flower gardens etc.

B. WEAKNESSES:

- Lack of interest among students in pursuing higher studies due to their socio-economic condition.
- Non-availability of funds from UGC or other sources for research projects.
- Paucity of sanctioned teaching posts.

C. OPPORTUNITIES:

- Developing research aptitude among students through events like Conferences, Seminars, Workshops
- > Signing agreements with local agro-based industries to facilitate placements of students.
- Engaging local small-scale business organisations to conduct career counselling for our students in order to promote self-employment.
- ➤ Helping the local farmers through extension activities like soil-testing in our geography laboratory.

D. CHALLENGES:

- ➤ It is difficult to persuade candidates to pursue higher studies due to lack of employment opportunities at the local level.
- > It is often found challenging to create interest in higher education among first generation learners.
- > It is also challenging to run all the academic activities with the unsatisfactory teacher-student ratio.
- ➤ It is also challenging to provide all the students with the benefits of online education due to the cost it entails and lack of network coverage in remote villages which are our primary catchment area.

E. RECOMMENDATIONS:

- Procure funds for minor and major research projects through agencies like UGC, DST, SERB etc.,
- Conduct of annual conference.
- > certificate programmes on industry related value Added Courses to enhance the Skill development of students
- > Starting Department- wise e- Journal
- > MOU with industries and relevant agencies for hands-on training and research
- > Minor Consultancy Projects with financial assistance from industry
